Beit T'Shuvah, a long-term treatment facility and synagogue in West Los Angeles, offers a treatment center that approaches addiction as a spiritual malady.

People with substance use disorders are offered a comprehensive Jewish spirituality that includes psychotherapy and redemption through right action and community.

The American Holistic Nurses Credentialing Corporation (AHNCC) and the Global Academy of Holistic Nursing (GAHN) are partnering to offer a documentary series, offered by TouchPoint Productions LLC, which explores the spiritual dimensions of addiction recovery, healing and reconciliation in different marginalized populations.



Sessions will be recorded for later viewing.

Each month a film will be watched and then a dialogue will be facilitated by an expert working with the population. Group interaction will be encouraged and supported. Documentaries are approximately 30 minutes long and will be followed by a 60 minute dialogue among the group (1.5 CE's per film)



Harriett's husband, Rabbi Mark Borovitz has established the Beit T'Shuvah congregation based on healing and hope. In addition to standard long-term care there is music therapy, a choir, and work related opportunities including a full service advertising agency. All people are welcome to treatment including those that have no means to pay for the services.

Harriett Rosetto, the founder, has discovered joy in her mission, "People come in hopeless and filled with self-hatred and through a sense of belonging they find meaning and purpose." This is a miracle and it happens here because this is a sanctuary that provides healing and the potential for transformation.

As Rabbi Mark puts it, "T'Shuvah is a Jewish concept that is a daily accounting of my soul. I reflect on what I have done well and what I haven't, who has been impacted and how they have been impacted. So now I don't lie anymore, I live with integrity, and I am an integrated human being. Addiction is driven by perfectionism, so now I don't always get it right but I have a way back through T'Shuvah."

This series consists of 6 documentaries that explore six (6) different diverse populations suffering from addiction disorders, in the United States.
